The total length end to end is some 30 odd miles, and Wreak (later corrupted to Wreake) is the old Norse word for winding. So a long and winding road it is, with, as recent events have shown, something new happening all along its length from Syston to Oakham.

The recent rebuilding of Syston junction bridge (see page 2) heralds a myriad of opportunities that I am sure will be realised in the fullness of time. This will put the restoration 'on the map' and provide us with a fitting front door as well as extensive facilities for those visiting the area.

Meanwhile, back at t'other end, Ron Francis regularly pulls together Oakham end volunteers to work along the canal at the Springfield or Rocks by Rail sites, making people aware of the waterway and enhancing the natural and built environment. Ron also regularly walks the canal line and talks to landowners about possibilities for future work.

Melton is roughly the centre of our network and, as the area of greatest population, receives our best attention. The planned staging of a trailboat rally (see page 3) to tie in with the revamped Melton Days will get us better noticed whilst the untiring work of our river clearance vessel crews ensures that the ring of river and canal around the town is slowly brought back to life.

Small pockets of inspiration pop up everywhere - being officially recognised by the Grand Union/Soar partnership was a nice surprise, as were the offers of help from locals in Oakham and Scouts in Melton. The opportunity to take tea at Teigh (see page 2) doesn't happen every day either and the number of walkers seen brandishing our walk leaflets is encouraging too. The changing attitude of most landowners to encompass the waterway's opportunities, rather than turn their backs, is heartening, so, yes, it seems things are happening everywhere and yes, it is a long and winding road. But if that seems a problem, then what a lovely problem to have.

I, for one, am not fazed by the challenges ahead and I believe if we, as a waterways society, take a holistic view of the whole length then we have nothing but good times to look forward to in the future.

IWA Trailboat Rally 2015

The society is close to putting in an application for hosting the above event. 2015 may seem a long way off, but we need to know that we have the necessary resources in place well in advance of that date. The parent organisation (The Inland Waterways Association) stipulate what we have to provide in terms of waterspace, slipway, moorings and ablutions (for the boat owners), and car parking, stall spaces and viewing areas (for the public). Most of these criteria already exist, due to the work of MOWS volunteers in previous years, and agreement has been reached, albeit verbally at this early juncture, on the various local permissions that are required to stage such an event.

IWA are keen that, if possible, the rally could be 'hung on' a larger event to give attendees something extra to participate in. Here in Melton we are fortunate that Melton day has not only been revived, but expanded to two days and is held at exactly the time of year that the IWA prefer.

So, with the majority of obstacles overcome, the remaining thing to assure our providers about is that we can staff the event. We do not anticipate that we would need droves of people - just a meet and greet posse to aid the trail boaters on their arrival and some to organise the traditional Saturday night barbeque and perhaps put up a couple of tents. To this end we are sending out letters to many major organisations in and around the Melton area, but in the meantime if you feel you as a MOWS supporter, could commit NOW to give a few hours help in two years time, please let us know. We need to have this facet securely in place to progress our application.

The Syston Hub

We may have some exciting news in the coming months regarding development of the area around the Syston junction and further up the Wreake. We have been in talks with the owners of the land which incorporates the area where the old toll house and isolation hospital used to stand. Watch this space for further developments.
