Sue reported that there is much more debris and litter to clear, which is only accessible from the river, especially between MOWS compound and the disused footbridge. One of our volunteers, Dave, has said he would be happy to assist with providing a boat so this area can be cleaned up.

The 2022 Annual General Meeting took place on Saturday 5 November at the Sysonby Knoll Hotel in Melton.

It was a lively meeting, despite attendance being slightly down on previous years. That said, we saw some new faces and much discussion ensued after time was called when we all tucked into the Danish pastries and cups of tea and coffee (always a good cuppa at the Sysonby Knoll Hotel).

The business side of the AGM went smoothly, with the previous year's minutes being adopted and this year's society accounts being approved, etc. The chairman read his report regarding the past year and announced at the end of his speech that he would be retiring from his role as chairman. A new chairman is yet to be announced.

Secondly, Eric Brown, who is heavily involved with Melton BID, and Rob Nash, a keen volunteer at the work parties, who knows more about breakfast cereals than anyone I have ever met (don't ask).

We are hoping that a couple of these people will be able to expedite our permissions for the rowing boat fleet (see article on page 4). We shall see if they can bring any pressure to bear but, in the meantime, rest assured the society remains in safe hands.

Footpath Rangers Report

There is a very significant amount of tree planting underway in fields between Frisby and Asfordby. My photo is taken from just below the Bellway development in Frisby, looking north towards the Asfordby Jelson housing estate. The River Wreake is in the background, bordered by a line of trees. We will have more details of the indigenous species in due course but as the trees mature into 'Frisby Forest', the landscape will change considerably. I have to say that despite the formality of the rows, I am really pleased at this new initiative by the Dawes family, who are local farmers, and have talked to Frisby school children and are getting them to do some planting later in the spring. After all, the woods are for them.

Ellen Senior of LCC is organising a briefing session on public rights of way at County Hall on 23 February. It is aimed primarily at volunteers who work on the Leicestershire Round, plus footpath volunteers who work in conjunction with their PCs. I will attend and feedback anything of interest.

Further Talks on River Landing Stage

Committee members recently held constructive meetings with Melton Borough Council and the Town Estate to explore ways of working together. At both meetings we were able to explain in detail current MOWS projects and long-term plans as well as explore areas where assistance might be available.

At a meeting with the Council's Growth & Regeneration Team, organised by "our own" Councillor Rob Bindloss, there was appreciation of the Society's continuing efforts to maintain the Melton Ring and recognition that there are many opportunities for developing it as a major attraction for both residents and visitors.

A starting point will be the introduction of our rowing boats (for those who are not up to speed, we have 7 rowing boats ready to launch as soon as some details are resolved). We also gave a briefing on the ongoing work developing the area around Eye Kettleby Lock as a destination for walkers, runners and cyclists (with an improved footpath from Melton) and the introduction of a trip boat from the town to the lock.

While the Society's ultimate aim is the reopening of the old Melton Navigation from Syston, there is general recognition that a focus on the Ring and the river to the lock (just over 2 miles of navigable waterway) can bring visible and very positive results in the short term.

The rowing boats need a landing stage and we had a continuation of earlier discussions with the Town Estate who are the owners of all the land alongside the River Eye as it flows through the town's parks. The Town Estate are very positive about the boats and also see them as a big attraction for the town. Hopefully the details can be sorted soon – ideally in time for the good weather to arrive so that hirers can enjoy the hidden delights of Melton's waterways.
